Eimear McBride grew up in the west of Ireland and trained at Drama Centre London before turning her attention to writing novels. Her books *A Girl is a Half-formed Thing*, *The Lesser Bohemians* and *Strange Hotel* have won numerous awards respectively, including the Baileys Women's Prize for Fiction and the James Tait Black Memorial Prize. In a 2018 Times Literary Supplement poll of 200 critics, Eimear was named one of the ten best British and Irish novelists writing today. Alongside writing her next novel, Eimear is an active screenwriter. In development is an adaptation of Anna Lyndsey's *Girl In The Dark* for See Saw Films; her adaptation of *The Lesser Bohemians* for DMC Film and BBC Film; and an original genre feature for Tessa Ross and House. Eimear has also recently wrapped on her directing debut, a short film titled *A VERY SHORT FILM ABOUT LONGING*, also for DMC Film and BBC Film and starring Joe Alwyn.
